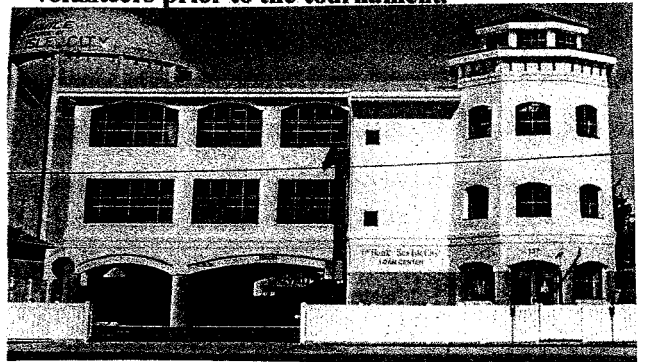
1st Bank of Sea Isle City Co Leads Successful Golf Tournament
