7TH Annual Run **Saturday, Nov. 30**

Join hundreds of runners, walkers and cheering spectators for Habitat Cape May County's 7th Annual 5K Thanksgiving Run and One Mile Walk. The Run and Walk will start at 9 am sharp, rain or shine, at the Cape May Co. Park and Zoo, off Route 9 in Middle Township. (Use the Route 9 entrance.)

The first 100 registered participants are guaranteed long sleeved Run tshirts. Registration for the Run costs \$18 prior to the race and \$20 on race day. Walk registration is \$15. For more details, see the flyer enclosed with this newsletter.

Sponsors still are needed.

Gold sponsors will have their name and logo printed on the front of the Run tshirts and on placards and banners throughout the course of the Run. Cost: \$1,000. Silver sponsors will have a 3"x5" space for their name/logo on the back of the shirts. Cost: \$500. Bronze sponsors will receive a 1"x2" logo space on the back of the shirts. Cost: \$350.

Deadline for sponsors is Nov. 15
